1. Excellence in Micro Business [less than 5 employees] *

The Excellence in Micro Business Award recognises a business that has effectively driven growth and can demonstrate the specific strategies implemented to achieve business success and/or resilience.

Entry criteria

Entrants must demonstrate their achievements in business excellence over the past 12 months at the time of entry. This category is open to businesses with fewer than five employees at the time of entry, that have been trading for more than 24 months.

Award eligibility check box

- ✓ This business has been trading for a continuous period of two years or more and is not bankrupt or trading insolvent at the time of entry.
- ✓ This business has fewer than five employees on the payroll in Australia at the time of entry.
- ✓ This business has not entered the categories of Outstanding Community Organisation, Outstanding New Business, Excellence in Small Business or Excellence in Business.
- ✓ A representative of this business has not been a judge in this category in 2025.
- ✓ A representative of this business is not a judge in the 2026 Business Awards program.

Award eligibility check box

- ✓ This business has been trading for a continuous period of two years or more and is not bankrupt or trading insolvent at the time of entry.
- ✓ This business has five to 20 employees on the payroll in Australia at the time of entry.
- ✓ This business has not entered the categories of Outstanding Community Organisation, Outstanding New Business, Excellence in Micro Business or Excellence in Business.
- ✓ A representative of this business has not been a judge in this category in 2025.
- ✓ A representative of this business is not a judge in the 2026 Business Awards program.

- ✓ This business has 21 or more employees on the payroll in Australia at the time of entry.
- ✓ This business has not entered the categories of Outstanding Community Organisation, Outstanding New Business, Excellence in Micro Business or Excellence in Small Business.
- ✓ A representative of this business has not been a judge in this category in 2025.
- ✓ A representative of this business is not a judge in the 2026 Business Awards program.

Entrants must demonstrate their commitment over the past 12 months to being an outstanding community organisation. This category is open to social enterprises and not-for-profit organisations that have been trading for a period of over 24 months at the time of entry.

Award eligibility check box

- ✓ The organisation has been trading for a continuous period of two or more years and is not bankrupt or trading insolvent at the time of entry.
- ✓ The organisation has not entered the categories of Outstanding New Business, Excellence in Micro Business, Excellence in Small Business or Excellence in Large Business.
- ✓ A representative of this business has not been a judge in this category in 2025.
- ✓ A representative of this business is not a judge in the 2026 Business Awards program.

Entry criteria

Entrants must demonstrate their commitment to being an outstanding start-up over the past 12 months. This category is open to businesses that have been trading for less than 24 months at the time of entry.

Award eligibility check box

- ✓ This business has been trading for a period of less than two years and is not bankrupt or trading insolvent at the time of entry.
- ✓ This business has not been purchased or acquired and is not part of a franchise.
- ✓ The business has not entered the categories of Outstanding Community Organisation, Excellence in Micro Business, Excellence in Small Business or Excellence in Business.
- ✓ A representative of this business has not been a judge in this category in 2025.
- ✓ A representative of this business is not a judge in the 2026 Business Awards program.

Award eligibility check box

- ✓ The business has been trading for a continuous period of two or more years and is not bankrupt or trading insolvent at the time of entry.
- ✓ A representative of this business has not been a judge in this category in 2025.
- ✓ A representative of this business is not a judge in the 2026 Business Awards program.

Entry criteria

Entrants must demonstrate their achievements in environmental sustainability over the past 12 months at time of entry. The category criteria are based on initiatives and projects within the business that are not related to its core offering.

Award eligibility check box

- ✓ The business has been trading for a continuous period of two years or more and is not bankrupt or trading insolvent at the time of entry.
- ✓ A representative of this business has not been a judge in this category in 2025.
- ✓ A representative of this business is not a judge in the 2026 Business Awards program.

Entrants must demonstrate their achievements over the past 12 months across the key areas of employee recruitment, engagement, and retention. Category criteria are based on initiatives that have had a positive impact on both employees and the business.

Award eligibility check box

- ✓ The business has been trading for a continuous period of two years or more and is not bankrupt or trading insolvent at the time of entry.
- ✓ A representative of this business has not been a judge in this category in 2025.
- ✓ A representative of this business is not a judge in the 2026 Business Awards program.

An inclusive business facilitates the needs of all its employees and customers.

Entry Criteria

Entrants must demonstrate their commitment over the past 12 months to address the needs of a diverse community. This category is open to businesses that have been trading continuously for two or more years.

Award eligibility check box

- ✓ The organisation has been trading for a continuous period of two or more years and is not bankrupt or trading insolvent at the time of entry.
- ✓ A representative of this business has not been a judge in this category in 2025.
- ✓ A representative of this business is not a judge in the 2026 Business Awards program.

The Outstanding Visitor Experience award recognises a business that understands the importance of visitor engagement for a region's economy* and reputation. The business needs to articulate how they promote the region while as well as offering an exceptional visitor experience.

Entry criteria

Entrants must demonstrate how their business showcases the region/community and how their offering is unique within their industry.

Award eligibility check box

- ✓ This business has been trading for a continuous period of two years or more and is not bankrupt or trading insolvent at the time of entry.
- ✓ A representative of this business has not been a judge in this category in 2025.
- ✓ A representative of this business is not a judge in the 2026 Business & Tourism Awards program.

The Excellence in Agribusiness award recognises a business that operates within or services the agribusiness sector and demonstrates outstanding performance, innovation, and contribution to the industry.

Entry criteria

Entrants must demonstrate their leadership within the agriculture and agribusiness sector, showcasing exceptional performance and their contribution to the industry, while demonstrating how they have effectively utilised resources to achieve successful outcomes and drive innovation over the past 18 months. To be eligible for this category, entrants must demonstrate their performance and industry contributions over the past 12 months.

Award eligibility check box

- ✓ This business has been trading for a continuous period of two years or more and is not bankrupt or trading insolvent at the time of entry.
- ✓ A representative of this business has not been a judge in this category in 2025.
- ✓ A representative of this business is not a judge in the 2026 Business & Tourism Awards program.

- Excellence in Small Business
- Excellence in Large Business

This award recognises a business that demonstrates achievements and excellence over and above all other entrants. This award will be judged by a panel of three judges, each of whom has not judged any other award entries.

Individual Categories

13. Outstanding Employee *

The Outstanding Employee Award recognises an inspirational employee who has demonstrated a passion for their role and a commitment to their workplace and the community.

Entry criteria

Employers are required to highlight their employees' commitment over the past 12 months to their workplace, the community, and to being an outstanding employee. To be eligible to enter this category, the employee must have been employed by their current employer for a minimum of 18 months at the time of entry.

Additional T&Cs

In addition to the general T&Cs, the following apply to this category:

Should the entrant leave the organisation before the Regional or State Gala event, they will not be eligible to receive an award.

Award eligibility check box

- ✓ The employee has been employed by their current employer for at least 18 months at the time of entry.
- ✓ The employee is not a Regional President, State Councillor or Board Member of NSW Business Chamber Limited.

Entrants must demonstrate their ability to lead and inspire people, showcasing exceptional leadership skills, while demonstrating how they have effectively utilised resources to achieve successful outcomes and drive innovation over the past 18 months. To be eligible for this category, the individual must have held a senior management or executive-level position within their organisation for a minimum of 18 months at the time of entry.

Award eligibility check box

- ✓ I am aged 35 years or under at the time of entry.
- ✓ I am not an employee, Regional President, State Councillor or Board Member of NSW Business Chamber Limited.
- ✓ I have not been a judge in this category in 2025.
- ✓ I am not a judge in the 2026 Business Awards program.

Entrants must demonstrate their ability to lead and inspire people, showcasing exceptional leadership skills, while demonstrating how they have effectively utilised resources to achieve successful outcomes and drive innovation over the past 18 months. To be eligible for this category, the individual must have held a senior management or executive-level position within their organisation for a minimum of 18 months at the time of entry.

Award eligibility check box

- ✓ I am aged 36 or over years at the time of entry.
- ✓ I am not an employee, Regional President, State Councillor or Board Member of NSW Business Chamber Limited.
- ✓ I have not been a judge in this category in 2025.
- ✓ I am not a judge in the 2026 Business Awards program.

Service with a Smile

Awarded to Dubbo's most popular employee, as voted by the public.

Roll of Honour Award

Jean Emile Serisier Roll of Honour Award

Recognises those who demonstrate outstanding entrepreneurial spirit, strategic business direction and innovative ideas, whilst inspiring a new generation of upcoming business leaders.

Judging of the 2026 Rhino Awards

The 2026 Rhino Awards and the NSW Business Chamber Business Awards follow a rigorous judging process at both the regional and state levels.

Judges are selected from subject matter experts or practitioners in the area relating to the award category, academics in the field, award category sponsors and NSW Business Chamber representatives.

All our judges come from outside the region and must declare any conflict of interest.

Judging takes place online, which is why only online entries will be accepted into the NSW Business Chamber Business Awards.

Entries are judged individually. Scores are then collated and averaged, and weightings are applied to achieve a final score.

Due to the volume of entries across all regions, entrants will not receive feedback from the judges regarding their entry.

Finalists will be announced once judging is complete.

Conditions of Entry

- a) All entrants or nominees must operate in a postcode within Dubbo Regional Council's local government area.
- b) Businesses must have been operating for more than two years unless the guidelines for the category the business is applying to specifically state otherwise.
- c) The judging panel reserves the right to place your entry into a category it feels most appropriate. The judging panel reserves the right to create or delete categories based on the entries received.
- d) The applicant acknowledges that if they win an award, the award is personal to the winner and is not assignable.
- e) Awards presented will be to the organisation or person named on the application form.
- f) No alterations to applications will be permitted after the date of submission, although submissions may be withdrawn before announcement of winners.
- g) A representative must be present at the gala function on 20th November 2026.
- h) There is no entry fee.
- i) Your privacy is protected, and all entries are regarded as CONFIDENTIAL, and all individuals involved in the judging process are required to complete a Confidentiality Agreement.
- j) Entries must be submitted using the entry portal noted below. All required questions must be answered to be eligible.
- k) All entrants or nominations must be registered with the ATO as a business and hold a current ABN number.
- l) Eligible winners of the starred categories will receive automatic entry into the 2027 Western NSW Business Awards. To be eligible, a winner must be a member of the Dubbo Business Chamber and have subscribed to our alliance with the NSW Business Chamber; or be a member of the NSW Business Chamber.
- m) State category winners from 2025 cannot enter the same category in 2026 but can enter a different category or categories.
- n) The winner of the Gold Rhino award is selected by the judges.
- o) The Gold Rhino Award will be awarded to the business with the most points awarded across all the business categories.
- p) Where there is more than one business with the same total point balance, the winner will be determined by the business with the most points awarded in the general question section of their entry/ies.
- q) Sponsors may enter the awards but may not enter the category that they are sponsoring.
- r) Entry is not open to office bearers of the Dubbo Business Chamber.
